Walking with Patient Trust

— A note from Pastor Ken —

On March 29th the 2018 Major League Baseball season had its opening day. Plenty of my friends reworked their schedules to they could watch their favorite teams jog out onto the field and play in what has been called "America's favorite pastime." For myself, I have yet to actually catch a game though I hope to remedy that soon.

Baseball is slow and methodical. I suspect that is why many would disagree with my brother and do not enjoy the game. In our world today, most people prefer things to move quickly. And that's not baseball.

One my fraternity brothers used to talk about how baseball reminded him of walking. At least partially this is because walks are a part of baseball. When the pitcher throws four balls outside the strike zone that are not swung upon, the batter gets to walk down to first. But also for him because the game develops slowly. The game feels like a walk, rather than a run. Football, he said, felt like running. But he preferred the slow walk of baseball.

He then moved the conversation into how we need to find time to walk in our lives. Far too often he said we try to move quickly from experience to experience and miss things. We miss things that we might pay more attention to if we were to walk more often than run.

I bring this up, not only because I enjoy the game of baseball and cheering on my St. Louis Cardinals, but also because I need to be reminded to walk. With spring working its way into our lives there can be a tendency to want to run into it. We want to leave the cold and darkness of winter and so our society gives us plenty to do to usher in the warmth and light of spring.

There are youth soccer games. There are vacations to be had. There is garden work. There are lawns to be maintained. There is cleaning to be done. There are all kinds of things that moves us along. All kinds of things that have us bounding into activity. And while activity is a good thing, I also hope that we will take time to walk.

Now of course I am not only talking about our physical lives, but about our whole life. I am talking about finding time to slow ourselves down and walk so that we might see what's around us.

I was talking to a friend recently and the more we talked, the more she said something of this to me. I was talking about all sorts of things that are going on and my impatience for the slow movement. I talked about the steps I was trying to take to speed things up. And that is when she stopped me. She said, "Ken, trust in the long, slow work of God."

As she said this I was reminded of a note that sits above my desk. It was written by Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a French philosopher and Jesuit priest and was introduced to me many years ago. While he doesn't specifically talk about walking, Pierre does implore us to slow down and move in a new way. I offer the prayer here in hopes that we might find ways to walk together as the baseball season commences, spring unfolds and we live life together.

BIBLE STUDY


11am on Thursdays
